



AMMUNITION TRANSACTION QUESTIONNAIRE

Thank you for expressing a willingness to assist in CRPA and NRA's legal efforts against California's unconstitutional ammunition sales restrictions. A lawsuit titled [Rhode v. Becerra](#) has already been filed to challenge the new laws. Kim Rhode, six-time Olympic medal winner, is leading the lawsuit as the named plaintiff. Joining her are several other law-abiding California gun owners and out of state businesses who can no longer directly serve California customers. Although the lawsuit has already been filed, CRPA is looking to collect statistical information from individuals and businesses regarding how the upcoming July 1, 2019 ammunition sales restrictions affect customer transactions. We will be able to use this information as additional evidence in support of the [Rhode](#) lawsuit, including any request for an injunction.

To that end, if you are an individual who was denied an ammunition transaction or a licensed vendor having difficulty selling ammunition to customers, you can assist our efforts by completing the attached questionnaire. We do ask that you allow our office to share your responses with representatives of the National Rifle Association of America, California Rifle & Pistol Association, Incorporated, and Gun Owners of California, Inc., who will be assisting us in compiling the information we receive. Additionally, individuals from these organizations may contact you to discuss your responses. Should you prefer we not share your information with them, just let us know in your responses.

QUESTIONNAIRE FOR INDIVIDUALS DENIED AMMUNITION PURCHASE

NOTE: If you are unsure whether you are legally eligible to possess ammunition, you should consult a lawyer before filing out this questionnaire.

1. Please provide your name and contact information (including an email and phone number).
2. May we share your responses with representatives of the National Rifle Association of America, California Rifle & Pistol Association, Incorporated, and Gun Owners of California, Inc., who will be assisting us in compiling the information we receive from individuals such as yourself?
3. What date did you attempt to purchase ammunition from a licensed ammunition vendor?
4. Which California licensed firearms dealer or licensed ammunition vendor were you purchasing ammunition from?
5. Approximately how far away is the vendor from your residence? (Both distance and drive time)
6. What background check option did you use for the transaction? (COE Verification, AFS Match, or Basic Ammunition Eligibility Check?)
7. Did you have all the necessary documentation with you required for the transaction? If not, what were you missing?

8. If you selected the AFS match option and were denied, what was the reason for denial? (You can obtain the reason by referring to your "Ammunition Transaction Number" provided by the dealer/vendor and logging into DOJ's CFARS website at <https://cfars.doj.ca.gov/>)

9. If you selected the AFS match option and were denied, have you been able to correct or update your information to avoid future denials? If so, how long did this process take?

10. If you selected the COE verification option and were denied, what was the reason for denial? (You can obtain the reason by referring to your "Ammunition Transaction Number" provided by the dealer/vendor and logging into DOJ's CFARS website at <https://cfars.doj.ca.gov/>)

11. If you selected the Basic Ammunition Eligibility Check option and were denied, what was the reason for denial? (You can obtain the reason by referring to your "Ammunition Transaction Number" provided by the dealer/vendor and logging into DOJ's CFARS website at <https://cfars.doj.ca.gov/>)

12. Would you be willing to sign a declaration under penalty of perjury regarding some or all of the information you have provided in this questionnaire?
